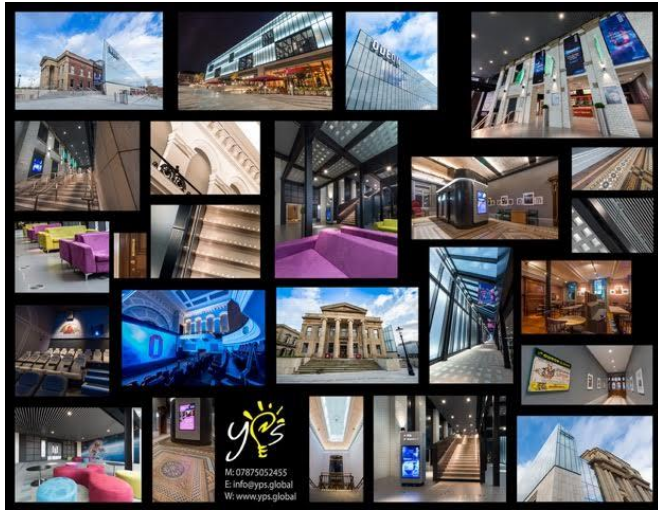


## ODEON Oldham collects more awards

ODEON's seven screen cinema centred in Oldham's Old Town Hall, a Grade II listed building, has won numerous accolades with its combination of modern architecture and key heritage elements. These wonders include the preservation of the Crown Court, a beautiful staircase, Minton and terrazzo tile floors, and some priceless paintings depicting the industrial heritage of the area.
